NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Comrade Jimoh Oyibo during his address
emphasized on the urgent need for the Federal

Government to address the foreign exchange challenges in order to prevent the food and beverage sector from imminent collapse.

He also highlighted the dangerous threat to food security as being presently experienced due to the incessant invasion of farmlands by herdsmen nationwide.

Comrade Oyibo hinged his warning on the inherent danger capable of plunging the nation into food crisis if the attacks on farmers and their produce by terrorists were not urgently addressed by the Federal and State governments.

He further stated that the heavy taxation imposed by bandits parading themselves as herdsmen on farmers before they can access their farmlands, as well as the increasing trend of farmers having to provide their own security at an exorbitant cost by hiring security guards to protect their farmlands, would have a negative impact on ensuring sufficient food supply across the country.

"Since we rely on produce from our local farmers, heavy taxation being forced on farmers by herdsmen in order to access their farmlands and some farmers now securing their farmlands with hired security guards will contribute to the food insufficiency across the country", he declared.

HISTORY OF FOBTOB BY THE GENERAL SECRETARY



The Association known as Food Beverage Tobacco Senior Staff Association was formally registered on August 1978, to organize 15th, qualified senior staff workers for membership, advancing their education, and benefits and providing assistance as outlined in the constitution.

The General Secretary, shared that this great Association's journey began in 1977 when the Federal Government reorganized trade unions into industrial unions. Comrade Ralph Alabi, the First President, created the first FOBTOB logo and the payoff line quote; Towards Better Living. Meanwhile, the Treasurer, Mrs. Elizabeth Wyse, coined the acronym FOBTOB, which is still in use today. The Association has experienced significant growth, expanding to forty-eight branches with over seven thousand members. He listed the past Presidents of our Association thus:

ANNIVERSARY WORKSHOP (ENFORCING WORKERS' RIGHT IN **NIGERIA) BY MR ANDY EGBOH**

It is important to remember that human rights are inherent should be respected for individuals, regardless of their race, sex, nationality, ethnicity, language, religion, or any other status. As a Director from the Federal Ministry of Labour, Mr. Andy Egboh noted that

these rights include the right to life and liberty, freedom from slavery and torture, freedom of opinion and expression, the right to work and education, and many more. However, Mr. Andy while not seeming to disagree with the United Nation's notion of Fight for your rice before your rights' pointed out that workers should not allow themselves to be dehumanized just for food, adding that it is unacceptable for workers to accept servitude or the loss of their right to association, socio-political rights, and safety at work just to hold onto their jobs. Furthermore, he posited that is important to note that Nigerian workers have the right to freely assemble, as this is clearly stated in Section 40 of the Constitution. Any abridgment of this right is unlawful and illegal, and employers should not be allowed to ban workers from forming or joining unions with reckless abandon. He opined that even though these illegal and unconstitutional practices are rampant; the Labour Ministry has not taken any action to enforce the Constitution and Labour laws. In fact, some employers freely belong to their employer unions while denying their employees the same right. It is on this premise that the Labour Director is advocating for the deregulation of labour and removing it from the exclusive list in the Constitution. Continuing, he said this is an outdated guest from colonial times when minimum labour standards were rejected in favour of allowing

employers to treat workers anyhow and with impunity. De-regulating labour would only lead to a situation where some states pay their workers a minimum wage of N30,000 while others only pay N5,000 monthly. He concluded by saying it is illogical to campaign that all workers should receive equal pay regardless of whether they are Federal, State, or Local Government employees.

NATION-WIDE PROTEST

On Wednesday 2nd August 2023, there was a nationwide protest held by the Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) and the Trade Union Congress of Nigeria (TUC). Our Association the Food Beverage and Tobacco Senior Staff Association (FOBTOB), being part of TUC Affiliates participated in the mass protest, against the Federal Government's unilateral decision to remove fuel subsidy without providing palliatives to cushion the effect in return.

The Organized Labour said that while it is not averse to petroleum subsidy removal, it insisted on the upward review of the minimum wage to Two Hundred Thousand Naira (N200,000), not minding any additional planned palliatives for Nigerians before the protest can be called off. The Labour leaders present at the rally expressed their grievances over the worsening social and economic conditions in the Country due to the fuel subsidy removal. The protest was led by the Organized Labour Union leaders in all the States of the

federation, Lagos inclusive while the Presidents of Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) and Trade Union Congress of Nigeria (TUC) met with President Bola Tinubu at the Government House in Abuja on the same day. They were also scheduled to meet with the National Assembly Leadership on Thursday 3rd August 2023 after their emergency National Executives Council meeting.
