INTERNATIONAL MEN'S DAY CELEBRATION

16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE 2023

Every year on 19th November, International Men's Day is celebrated to raise awareness about the issues faced by men and promote positive expressions of masculinity. The theme for the 2023 celebration was "ZERO MALE SUICIDE" highlighting the importance addressing this critical issue. FOBTOB Women, in recognizing the impact of FOBTOB Men, celebrated this remarkable day with a cakecutting event. The Women Leader, Comrade Bunmi Adesayo, mentioned that the celebration was a great opportunity for men to be and celebrated recognised, for contributions to the society. She encouraged the male counterparts to lead by example and teach boys about societal values, character, and responsibilities of being a man. She then quoted Mahatma Gandhi, who says " We must become the change we seek," by setting an example that depicts a fair and safe society that allows everyone to prosper.



During the Annual United Nations campaign, the 16 Days of Activism for No Violence against Women and Children, which took place from 25th November to 10th December, several significant days were observed, including the International Day for Persons Disabilities, World AIDS Day, International Day for No Violence Against Women. At the Western Zonal meeting held on 18th November, 2023, at CWAY Foods and Beverages Nigeria Company Limited, Ota, Ogun State, the Women in the Food, Beverage, and Tobacco Senior Staff Association (FOBTOB) commemorated the campaign by highlighting the discriminatory practice of sublimating Maternity Leave with Annual Leave. This practice reduces the total amount of time a

woman can take off work for maternity-related reasons, which can have particularly dire consequences in cases of complicated pregnancies or childbirths that require extended time to recover. FOBTOB emphasised that Maternity Leave and Annual Leave are two distinct rights that should not be conflated.

Maternity Leave is specifically designed to ensure that women receive the necessary time off work to recover from childbirth and bond with their newborns. On the other hand, Annual Leave is a worker's right to take time off work to rest and recharge, and it should not be used to sublimate Maternity Leave.

The discriminatory practice of sublimating Maternity Leave with Annual Leave was noted as an issue that needs to be addressed. Discrimination against women in the workplace is common, and it is time to take action to ensure that all employees are treated fairly and equally.

FOBTOB is leading the way in advocating for the elimination of this unjust practice and upholding Maternity Leave and Annual Leave as separate workers' rights. Comrade Bunmi Adesayo, the
