### GLOBAL UNIONS CONVENE VIRTUAL MEETING TO ADDRESS DAIRY MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY IN NIGERIA

On August 8, 2024, the International Union of Food, Agriculture, Hotel, Restaurant, Catering, Tobacco, and Allied Workers Associations (IUF) held a significant virtual meeting in Geneva, Switzerland, focused on the Dairy Manufacturing Industry in Nigeria. Sue Longley, the General Secretary of IUF, chaired the meeting, with Brother Christian Hoerbelt, Dairy and Milk Sector personnel in America and Asia, serving as the co-host.

The primary objective of this crucial meeting was to conduct a comprehensive assessment of the current state of the Dairy Manufacturing Industry in Nigeria. The participants delved into key focus areas, which included examining challenges and opportunities within the industry, encompassing issues related to labour rights, organizing, and market dynamics. Notably, the meeting facilitated in-depth extensive discussions among the participants, aiming to identify and explore potential strategies for the sustainable growth and development of the dairy sector in Nigeria. Importantly, major players in the industry, such as Promasidor Nigeria Limited, Nestle Nigeria Plc, Friesland Campina WAMCO Nigeria Plc, Fan Milk Plc, Cway Foods and CHI Limited, under the **FOBTOB** and NUFBTE, auspices of actively participated in the discussions.

## IUF NIGERIA WOMEN EMPOWERS WOMEN AT A WORKSHOP ON GENDER APPROACH TO OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY (OHS), HIV/AIDS, AND MENTAL HEALTH

The International Union of Food, Agricultural, Hotel, Restaurant, Catering, Tobacco and Allied Workers' Association (IUF) Nigeria recently organized an insightful workshop focusing on the topic "Gender Approach to Occupational Health & Safety (OHS), HIV/AIDS, and Mental Health" on Wednesday, August 21, 2024, at the Seven-Up Bottling Company Limited, Abuja Plant, Abuja. The workshop brought together prominent figures such as IUF Nigeria Women's Coordinator, Comrade

The workshop fostered constructive conversations

The workshop fostered constructive conversations about how gender-related issues influence Occupational Health and Safety (OHS), HIV/AIDS, and Mental Health in the workplace. Participants shared their personal experiences, shedding light on gender-based violence, the gender pay gap, stereotypes, bias, and the essential need for enhanced female leadership representation at all organizational levels. Furthermore, discussions highlighted concerns regarding male colleagues intimidating female coworkers and the use of inappropriate language within work environments.

Wrapping up the workshop, the Speaker, Comrade Bunmi Adesayo, introduced a book called The Five Languages of Love, along with a resounding key takeaway message: "If you don't train them, don't blame them, know your status (KYS), and protect yourself".
